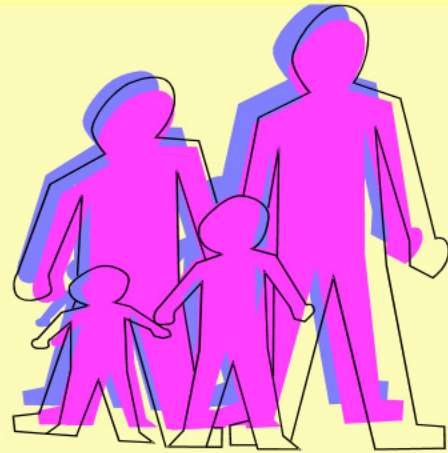

## Day 1

### Opening Session:

Factors that promote successful prosocial lifestyles at an individual, family, neighbourhood and systems level.

### Parents/Families Panel:

Challenges and issues that impact our ability to keep our children safe from gang membership and the criminal justice system.

### Youth Panel:

Youth will conduct three short skits to demonstrate what hasn't worked from their perspective in successfully avoiding gang involvement and the criminal justice system.

A panel then will be convened with youth responding to a series of questions around their involvement and needs including the things which assist with successful reintegration post incarceration.

### Breakout Rooms:

Groups will be divided by geographical neighbourhoods. This will include youth, their family members, service providers, school representatives, probation and policy makers. The first part of the task is "To identify what is needed at the individual level, family level, neighbourhood level, school and external program level to achieve successful prosocial lifestyles". The second part of the task is "How can we collaborate more effectively in responding to the needs of the youth, their family and their neighbourhood".
